John William Sundby, 74, of Longview, passed away at his home Friday, May 31, 2002, in Longview, Texas at the age of 74 and after a lengthy illness.

Graveside services will be 12 noon Monday, at Memory Park Cemetery with Dr. W. D. O'Neal officiating under the direction of Rader Funeral Home of Longview.

He was born August 20, 1927 in Minneapolis, MN and moved to Longview from El Dorado, Arkansas in 1932 with his family.

Mr. Sundby returned home to Longview in 1987 after retiring from Exxon.

He graduated from Longview High School in 1945 and attended Kilgore Jr. College and later, Tyler Jr. College. He went to work for Humble Oil Co. which later became Exxon and retired from there after years of service. He served in the Navy during World War II.
