Marcia graduated valedictorian of her high school in the small East Texas community of Campbell, Texas. Graduating when she was fifteen, she had acquired enough college work in two yearsthree days short of her 18th birthday to start her 38 year teaching career in Nelda, Texas. Nelda High School was her first school and Longview High School, the last. A longtime member of First United Methodist Church in Longview, she was active in the United Methodist Women, holding numerous offices. With her husband Jack, she also volunteered many hours in the church library and other areas.

Jack Franklin Lynch was the other half of a loving team, their marriage lasting almost 63 years. One daughter, Anne Lynch Orr, her spouse, Jay B.
