Mrs. Partin was born March 10, 1913 in Cleveland, Texas and came to Price, Texas with the East Texas Oil Boom in 1939, with her husband Bob. She is survived by two sons, Edgar Partin and Avery Partin of Henderson; one daughter and son-in-law, Mildred and Harold Sadler. She is also, survived by two sisters, Ida Riggs of Huntsville, Texas and Jimmie Lee of Liberty, Texas; 8 grandchildren, 26 great grandchildren, and one great great granddaughter. She was preceded in death by her husband Bob Partin in 1978. She was a member of the First Baptist Church where she was a member of the Radio Bible Class.
