Marguerite W. "Maggie" Cottle, 89, passed away peacefully on Saturday, February 9, 2013. A Memorial Service will be held at 2:00 pm Saturday, February 23, 2013 at St. Andrew Presbyterian Church in Longview, Texas, with the Rev. Scott Hookey officiating. Her ashes will be interred beside her husband at the Aztlan Masonic Cemetery in Prescott, Arizona.

Maggie was born on April 19, 1923 and grew up in Charleston, West Virginia. She married the love of her life and husband of 53 years, Howard Allen Cottle, on October 15, 1947, in Johnson City, Tennessee. Maggie was a loving mother for her family of five sons and proudly told anyone who would listen that "not a one of them had ever gotten into any trouble."

While raising her family, Maggie was a proud full-time employee of Sears Roebuck and Company for 30 years.
