Our sweet mom and grandmother, Geraldine Worley Garner Triplett, was welcomed to heaven by her Father in the early morning hours on February 27, 2016. Heaven has gained a wonderful servant with a smiling face and a giving heart.

Geraldine has lived a very full and active 92 years. She was born at home in Rochester, Texas on March 11, 1923. She had 9 brothers and sisters and was 5th of 10 children born to Ben and Bertha Worley. She graduated from Old Glory High School and excelled in math and sports. Her mom was a midwife and as a teenager, Geraldine drove her mother in their horse driven wagon to help deliver babies. At age 16 she became a Christian and was a faithful member her whole life. She led the way for all of us in our family. She became a nurse during WWII when training was hands-on and was a nurse for several doctors during her lifetime. She married John L Garner, the father of her children, in 1943. She lived in Lockhart, Morton, Old Glory, Earth, Aspermont, Dallas, and Longview (all over Texas). She loved sewing, crocheting, quilting, and making Priscilla dolls always looking for her next project. In 1976, she made her first Priscilla doll for her granddaughter Heather Ray Burris who was about to have surgery. Since then, Geraldine has made over 100 dolls for grandchildren, great-grandchildren, fundraisers, and gifts to needy children. She has sewn costumes and uniforms for many of our children's programs. She was even crocheting baby hats for Threads of Love last week and was always willing to help anyone who needed her. After the death of John L in 1987, Geraldine married E.F. Triplett and was married to him for 13 years. "Trip" loved her dearly and they travelled to different countries and loved living in Fort Stockton and San Angelo before his death in 2002. Since then, Geraldine has lived in 3 different retirement homes and was "Senior Olympic Pool Champion" in San Angelo. In 2007, she moved to Longview and has lived in Buckner Westminster Place. She called this sweet place the best retirement center of all. We are all indebted to the kind and sweet friends and helpers at Buckner – a wonderful Christian atmosphere. Geraldine was a member of Alpine Church of Christ and was active in the Fun Bunch group with her good friend Bessie Kyle. Geraldine loved the Texas Rangers and watched every game!
