Funeral services for Lester O. Nugent, 86, of Longview will be held at 10 AM Tuesday, March 8, 2016 in the Chapel of Rader Funeral Home of Longview with Bro. The family will receive friends Monday evening from 5-7 PM at the funeral home.

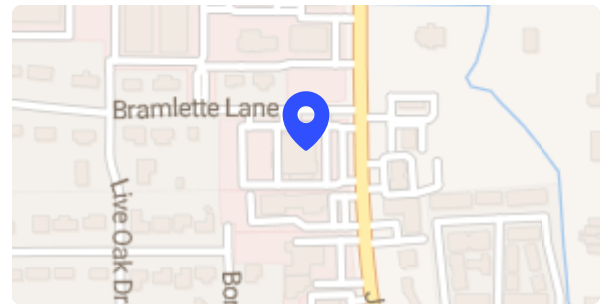

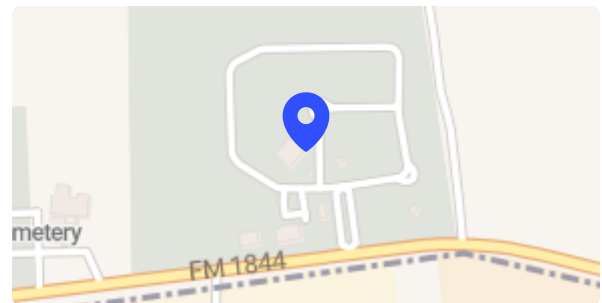
