She was a graduate of the first accredited class of White Oak High School and was a registered nurse. 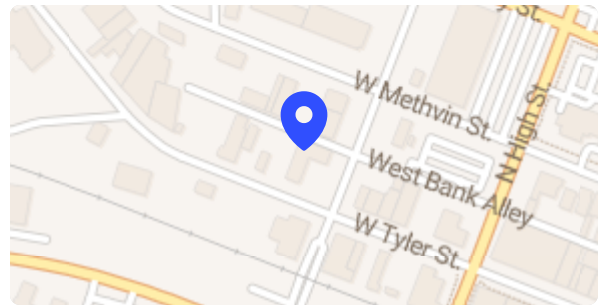
