She was born in Marshall, TX to R.D. Alexander and Ruby Louise Mcfarien. At age 22 she met her first husband Ronald Reimer in Waco, where they were married 12/4/1964. For many years they moved around before finally making a home in the suburbs of Detroit, Michigan where for several years they raised their 2 boys James Joseph Reimer (d 2023) and Bradford Lee Reimer, whom she is survived by.
